In 2011, her early career was celebrated in the ABC mini-series Paper Giants: The Birth of Cleo. She has twice been voted Australia's most admired woman. She's the mother of two and a grandmother of five and has even been immortalised in the 1980 Cold Chisel song, Ita. Outside her impressive career in journalism, she's a best-selling author of 11 books including her autobiography, A Passionate Life, and is hard at work on her 12th book. Her current charitable responsibilities include serving as Chair of the Australian Mental Health Prize Advisory Group and as National Ambassador of Dementia Australia following her term as National President from 2011-2014. She is also Patron of the Macular Disease Foundation, Emeritus Director of Arthritis Australia and Ambassador for Breast Cancer Network Australia. She received an AO for her services to the community especially in the field of public health education when she spearheaded Australia's HIV/AIDS Education Program, an OBE for her services to journalism, and a Centenary Medal for business leadership. In 2014 Sydney's Macquarie University conferred an Honorary Doctor of Letters on Ita in recognition of her contribution to the arts. In 2015, Ita was conferred an Honorary Doctor of Letters by the University of Wollongong, for her contribution to mental health and ageing.

Its original construction was in 1732 and is now in magnificent condition after two disastrous fires in 1808 and 1856.

Day 6 Friday 19 July 2019

Londo

After a casual start to the day we take a ride on the spectacular London Eye to get a bird's eye view of this lively and sophisticated city. It is the world's second-largest ferris wheel and most popular paid tourist attraction in the United Kingdom, with over 3.75 million visitors annually. Olden / Nordfjord - Norway

This morning our local guide will introduce us to the history and culture of picturesque Olden, located at the head of Nordfjord, the 6th-longest fjord in the country. It has a population of around 500 and its two churches date from approximately 1300. Scenic and serene Nordfjord is situated between the biggest glacier in mainland Europe and Norway's wildest stretch of coast at Stad. This 150-km-long area from west to east and ocean to glacier, offers lots of great and readily accessible scenic and cultural experiences.

Day 11 Wednesday 24 July 2019 Andalsnes / Romsdalsfjord-Norway

After meeting our local guide we will learn about the famous fly-fishing in the Rauma River and the history and customs of Andalsnes including the landing of British troops in April 1940 as part of the pincer movement to take Trondheim. Remember to bring your camera to capture the spectacular and dramatic scenery surrounding this charming and friendly town at the base of the towering Romsdal Alps with its majestic mountain peaks.

Day 12 Thursday 25 July 2019

At sea

Today Ita will present *Part 2 of My Life and the Media* complete with refreshments and tea/coffee. It will be exciting to hear Ita, who has twice been voted Australia's most admired woman discuss, among many other topics, her role as Ambassador of Breast Cancer Network Australia, her AO for spearheading Australia's HIV/AIDS Program and her Centenary Medal for Business Leadership.

Day 13 Friday 26 July 2019

Akureyri - Iceland

This morning we dock in Akureyri, the unofficial capital of northern Iceland. During our guided tour we will visit one of Iceland's most famous 19th-century turf houses at Laufas, constructed in the traditional Icelandic style of stone and turf. It is one of the few remaining in the country. Our visit will also include the fascinating regional museum and charming local country church built in 1865. On our return to Akureyri, we will visit the Botanical Gardens, with its specialty in Arctic plants.

Day 14 Saturday 27 July 2019

Isafjordur - Iceland

During our guided tour of the town it will be interesting to view Osvor, the 19th-century fisherman's hut that was restored in 1988. The drive onto Bolungarvik village will reveal spectacular mountain views and Westfjord's beautiful but sometimes harsh landscape. Our coach will then move on to the Buna Tungua River and Tunguskogur waterfall where we can sip the indescribably pure and crystal clear mountain water. The fjords on the northwest coast and mountains rising from the sea combine to produce breathtaking scenery. Don't forget to bring your camera!

Day 15 Sunday 28 July 2019

Reykjavik - Iceland

This morning Arcadia docks at Reykjavik, the capital and largest city in Iceland and gateway to the country's stunning natural wonders, ranging from icefields to boiling thermal pools. Our coach and guide will introduce us to the 'Golden Circle', where we see the world-famous high-temperature Geyser geothermal area with amazing spouting springs in varying formations. Interestingly, this is where the name geyser originated. The nearby spectacular Gullfoss (Golden Waterfall) sends massive quantities of water smashing violently into a deep meandering gorge. Our tour concludes when we visit the site of Iceland's ancient parliament and the place where we can view the American and Eurasian tectonic plates pulling apart at the rate of a few centimetres per annum.

Day 16 Monday 29 July 2019

Reykjavik - Iceland

Today will be a quite different and unique experience when we visit the world renowned Blue Lagoon and have the opportunity to immerse ourselves in its beautiful milky-turquoise opaque water (optional) – remember to bring your swimming gear! Formed in 1976, it's warm and soothing, mineral enriched seawater renews every 48 hours. You are free to enjoy entering the cave where an audio guide provides fascinating information about the lagoon. Following lunch and perhaps a visit to the gift shop for some healthcare and skin products we return to the Arcadia.

Day 17 Tuesday 30 July 2019

Atsea

A relaxing day on the Arcadia lies in wait for you to perhaps visit the fully equipped, state of the art gym, whirlpool spa, sauna or steam room. It also maybe an opportune time to attend bridge, dance or watercolour classes or indulge your tastebuds at Sindhu restaurant that showcases the cuisine of trice Michelin-starred Atul Kochar in spectacular style.

Day 18 Wednesday 31 July 2019
